
Spheres Of Light Sydney & Nowra Full Moon Circles 22nd & 29th April 2016



SERKET

Introduction

On this night we will connect to the energy of the Scorpio/ Taurus Full Moon under the guidance of Serket. Serket is a fairly unknown funerary goddess so we should always proceed with caution when we don't fully understand an unknown deity's energy. Our intent and magical exercise will fit with the power and mystery of the scorpion and Samhain. Our full moon ritual will be essentially a journey into Duat (the underworld).

The Full Moon in Scorpio is bringing light to all the shadow dynamics that lie underneath the surface- the very things we don't want to look at or have been avoiding dealing with are likely to come to Light right now.Scorpio pulls us in to the mysterious depths...The dark has power, and that makes it daunting, but also a promising night — for deep change and renewal. What comes to mind with this Scorpio peak is that it's a time to come home to the power of the imagination to shape your life.

Círcle format for 2016

A meditation will be conducted before the ritual begins, prior to casting the circle.

The Four Guardían Neteru [pronounced neecheroo] are:

- Qebhsennuf [kebs-noof]
- Duamutef [doo-a-moo-tef]
- Imsety [im-set-ee]
- Hapí [hah-pee]

Together they are called the Sons of Horus.

Opening the Circle

- Call in the Sons of Horus (sunwise E, N, W, S.)
- After quarter calls turn sunwise (anticlockwise) to face the Altar/Shrine
- Strike drum or shake rattle
- Call in the Heavens
- Strike drum or shake rattle; The Circle is now Cast.
- Light the Candles on the Altar/Shrine
- Call The Shining Eye of Horus Comes
- Invoke Deity
- State Intent
- Conduct Activity

Closing the Circle

- Farewell Deity
- Close Quarters (anti-sunwise S, W, N, E.)
- <u>Ending</u> Qebhsennuf leaving, taking the elementals with him closing the doors to the elemental world. Extinguish outer Candles. Take centre candle from the altar and carry it anti-sunwise (clockwise) around the circle <u>saying</u> (all together):

<u>Say</u> - As we call Qebhsennuf [kebs-noof], picture him approaching in the form of a falcon, a golden bird of prey. See him come to rest at the edge of the circle in the form of a tall, falcon-headed man. Behind him picture a sunny sky with wind swept clouds.

Do - Strike drum or shake rattle

<u>Say</u> - Hail to you Lords and Ladies of the East; Powers of Air. Hail Lord Qebhsennuf! Please be present at this sacred place and witness this rite! Qebhsennuf! (kebs-noof)

Closing The Circle

Do - Strike drum or shake rattle

<u>Say</u> - Lord and Ladies of the East; Powers of Air, And Lord Qebhsennuf. Thank you for attending this Rite. Hail and Farewell!

Ending - Qebhsennuf leaving, taking the elementals with him closing the doors to the elemental world.

<u>Do</u> - Extinguish outer Candles. Take the centre candle from the altar and carry it clockwise around the circle, <u>saying</u>:

<u>Say</u> - As we call Duamutef [doo-a-moo-tef], picture him as a black jackal approaching through the desert landscape. He comes to rest at the edge of the circle in the form of a jackal-headed man. Behind is a background of flames.

Do - Strike drum or shake rattle

<u>Say</u> - Hail to you Lords and Ladies of the North; Powers of Fire. Hail Lord Duamutef! Please be present at this sacred place and witness this rite.

<u>Do</u> - Stríke drum or shake rattle

<u>Say</u> - Lords and Ladies of the North; Powers of Fire, and Lord Duamutef. Thank you for attending this Rite. Hail and Farewell!

Ending

(after all 4 Sons of Horus are farewelled) <u>all say</u> as Qebhsennuf walks the circle:

West

Opening The Circle

<u>Say</u> - As we call Imsety [im-set-ee], picture him as a bearded man standing on the seashore with waves behind him.

Do - Strike drum or shake rattle

<u>Say</u> - Hail to you Lord and Ladies of the West; Powers of Water. Hail Lord Imsety! Please be present at this sacred place and witness this rite.

Imsety! (im-set-ee) Imsety! Imsety! Hail And Welcome!

Closing The Circle

<u>Do</u> - Strike drum or shake rattle

<u>Say</u> - Lords and Ladies of the West; Powers of Water, and Lord Imsety. Thank you for attending this Rite. Hail and Farewell!

Ending

(after all 4 Sons of Horus are farewelled) <u>all say</u> as Qebhsennuf walks the circle:

South

Opening The Circle

<u>Say</u> - As we call Hapi [hah-pee], picture him approaching in the shape of a baboon or ape. He stands at the edge of the circle as a man with a baboon shaped head. Behind him a scene of trees and plants.

Do - Strike drum or shake rattle

<u>Say</u> - Hail to you Lord and Ladies of the South; Powers of Earth. Hail Lord Hapi! Please be present at this sacred place and witness this rite.

Closing The Circle

<u>Do</u> - Stríke drum or shake rattle

<u>Say</u> - Lords and Ladies of the South; Powers of Earth, and Lord Hapi Thank you for attending this Rite. Hail and Farewell!

(after all 4 Sons of Horus are farewelled) <u>all say</u> as Qebhsennuf walks the circle:

Strike drum or shake rattle;

<u>Do</u> Líght the Candles on the Altar/Shríne

(after all 4 Sons of Horus are farewelled) <u>all say</u> as Qebhsennuf walks the circle:

Ending

(after all 4 Sons of Horus are farewelled) <u>all say</u> as Qebhsennuf walks the circle:

The circle format outlined above is used by Sydney and Nowra Circles. Each invocation has been printed out separately on papyrus styled paper, rolled and tied with ribbon coloured according to the elements and re-used for all rituals. However, each circle writes their own invocations to deity every full moon, and decides on their own intent and activity, so only those aspects of the ritual will differ and require printing anew each month.

Nowra Círcle (22nd April)

Meditation followed by quiet contemplation.

Opening: Calling the Sons of Horus

The Heavens are Opened...

The Shining Eye of Horus...

Invocation to Serket

Goddess Serket, Lady of the beautiful tent and the Western Heavens,

We stand before you tonight asking you to rid us of toxins lingering in our mind, body and soul.

Illuminate what is hidden, heal our wounds and revive us with your breath.

With your seven scorpions guard and protect us this night

Hail and Welcome.

Invocation to Nehebukau (Ne-he-bu-ka)

Nehebukau, Primeval Guardían of the Duat and God of Magick, We stand before you tonight asking you to protect us as we heal ourselves and release deeply hidden wounds.

Assist us in creating balance in our physical and spiritual bodies.

With your seven cobras guard and protect us this night.

Hail and Welcome.

Intent

Tonight is all about healing ourselves. It's about bringing our hidden and deeply embedded wounds to light, healing them and piecing ourselves back together in state of balance.

Activity

Prepare the Milk of Light.

Say the following...

"Hail Serket and Nehebukau

Grant that my soul may come to me from any place wherein it may be, Even if it would tarry, let me soul be brought to me from any place wherein it may

be.

Let me have possession of my Ba-soul and of my spirit-soul and let my word be truth with it, in every place wherein it may be.

Observe then you Guardíans of the Heaven my soul where ever it may be,

Even if it would tarry, cause you my Ba-soul to see my body.

May my Ba-soul gaze upon my earthly body and take up its abode.

May it neither perish, nor be destroyed for ever and for ever.

So Mote It Be"

Chant Ka Ba until we have raised enough energy of which we then project into our healing Milk of Light mixture. We then drink the milk and speak the following verse:

"Healing comes, healing flows, healing blossoms and it shows. Bring me now into the light. Help me to stand tall, balanced and with strength. Help me become one with my soul and heart."

Closing/Farewell to Deity

Serket

Goddess Serket, Lady of the beautiful tent and the Western Heavens,

Thank you for illuminating our deeply hidden wounds and for cleansing us of our toxins with your healing breath.

Thanks to you and your seven scorpions for you protection and guidance this night,

Hail and Farewell

Nehebukau (Ne-he-bu-ka)

Nehebukau, Prímeval Guardían of the Duat and God of Magíck,

Thank you for assisting us with creating balance of our body and soul after we healed ourselves and released old wounds.

Thanks to you and your seven cobras for your protection and guidance this night, Hail and Farewell

Farewell the Sons of Horus

Then, take the centre candle from the altar and carry it clockwise around the circle, saying: By holy flame of candle-fire,

The ritual ends at our desire.

The circle is down, and is no more,

All things are as they were before.

(Extinguish candles)

Sydney Circle (29th April at Samhain Retreat)

Before ritual we made amulet bracelets/necklaces with special beads made by Logan to represent the tail/sting of the scorpion. These amulets were consecrated and then to be worn during the ritual and any time we entered the sacred space (the underworld) which was left open for the two days.

Invocation to Serket

(Ad lib on the night)

Intent & Activity

Prior to ritual we made amulets with scorpion sting beads. During the ritual we wrote on a piece of paper the things we wanted to be rid of in our life. Logan had also constructed a scorpion tail out of clay, which we used to pierce our pieces of paper - to pierce our intent with the scorpion sting of Serket.
